Enter all authors, editors, translators (last name first)

Main Subject

Beethoven:

Enter FF (free-floating subdivisions to Beethoven's name) from Thesaurus

Other names:

Enter any other names. These are not in the Thesaurus, but you can check the existing database. Do not include birth/death dates. Includes subdivisions from the free-floaters supplemental list when appropriate.

Other subjects:

Enter any other MAIN SUBJECTS (music terms, topical or geographical subjects). Works listed must ALWAYS have topical subdivisions (see examples on next page).

For Beethoven, list subdivisions: Deafness – Financial affairs -- Influence on Schubert – Travels 1796 For repeated subdivisions for other subjects, group headings by strings, e.g.:
