 - Core content areas that <u>MUST</u> be completed within degree: Law & ethics (EDCO 232), Diagnostic Processes (EDCO 282), Assessment & Testing (EDCO 283)
 - All 13 must be completed before education can be approved
 - Missing coursework can be completed through approved institutions: <u>http://calpcc.org/graduate-course-providers</u>
- □ Supervised Fieldwork
 - Minimum 6 semester units (EDCO 292)
 - Minimum 280 face-to-face hours
