Course Format

This a hybrid course requiring internet connectivity. All activities are accessed through Canvas, the SJSU leaning management system. Some activities, such as quizzes, exams, and discussions, require online attendance during regular class times as specified in the attached course schedule. However, many lectures are recorded and posted on Canvas. They can be viewed at the student's convenience. See the attached schedule for more detailed information on course activities and the modes of participation.

Course Requirements and Assignments

This course requires regular reading assignments, recorded lectures, online homework, and participation in class discussions and other activities. Course concepts are cumulative, so students who fall behind will find it difficult to catch-up. Unforeseen circumstances may require changes to the attached schedule. Changes will be announced during class discussion periods and on Canvas as soon as possible. Students should check Canvas regularly for the latest information.

University Policy S16-9 requires the following language to be included in the syllabus:

It is available through OpenStax, the Spartan Bookstore, or elsewhere for \$35 or less.

Other technology requirements / equipment / material

You will need a basic calculator for use during quizzes, exams, and homework.

You will also need a device with internet access, preferably a desktop or laptop computer, to access the following applications:

<u>Canvas</u>: You will need to register for Canvas, which is free for all SJSU students. Instructions for enrolling in Canvas are available through <u>my.sjsu.edu/</u>. You will need to access this course on Canvas to participate in all course activities, including quizzes, exams, zoom meetings, and recorded lectures.

Zoom: There will be regular Zoom discussions and other activities which you will access through this course on Canvas. Attendance *per se* shall not be used as a criterion for grading per Academic Policy F-69-24. However, regular participation is **strongly** recommended.

Sapling Learning: There will be regular homework assignments in Sapling Learning. You must register for Sapling through Canvas as described below. There is a one-time fee of \$42.00. However, you may enroll in Sapling and begin doing the assignments before the fee is due, so you should do so immediately so as not to fall behind.

Missed quizzes, class activities, and Sapling assignments will not be excused except under extraordinary circumstances. However, I will drop your lowest grade from each of the Quizzes, Activities, and Sapling components when figuring out your final grade.

Grading Information

All activities will receive a numerical grade, based on your performance relative to others in the class (curved). It is not a percentage grade. At the end of the semester your numerical grade will be translated into a letter grade as follows; 100-97 A+, 96-93 A, 92-90 A-, 89-87 B+, 86-83 B, 82-80 B-, 79-77 C+, 76-73 C, 72-70 C-, 69-67 D+, 66-63 D, 62-60 D-, and less than 60 F. **Missed activities receive a grade of 50**.
