Course Description: This seminar is an examination of the significant texts from the last one hundred years or so. Our focus will included fiction and poetry. The sessions will be a combination of discussion and some brute information.

Course Requirements & Grading: Students are required to come to class prepared to discuss the readings assigned. They will likewise submit essays on the dates assigned and make two substantial presentations to the class. Two essays (one is 4-5 pp., the other 15-18) are required. The first essay is a close reading of one scene from one of the novels assigned. The second essay is comparative in nature and will involve library research. The first presentation will be on *Ulysses*. The second presentation will occur toward the end of the semester and will be on *Justine*. Details about the assignments will be given well in advance of the due dates. Short essay 20%; long essay 50%; presentations 20%; class participation 10%.
