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This course counts as an upper division elective for the English major. It has recently been revamped from 3 units to 4 and covers the major works of Geoffrey Chaucer, the first major English poet. We will read his works in the original and pay particular attention to the grammatical structures of Middle English. Students will be called upon to read the text aloud in Middle English pronunciation and to translate in class. When we get to the Canterbury Tales, please read the description of each pilgrim who appears in the General Prologue for the same class we read the corresponding tale. The Nun's Priest does not appear in the GP.
