

## TERMS AND CONDITIONS

### International Transfer Admission | Spring 2022

Your admission is “provisional” based on the academic information you provided on your application materials. This offer of admission is good only for this term and may not be deferred to another semester. Your admission will remain “provisional” until you have completed all of the mandatory steps below:

**Complete the Next Steps Intent to Enroll Process by Wednesday, December 1, 2021**

Complete the following steps in the Intent to Enroll process on the Next Steps website (<https://nextsteps.sjsu.edu>) by Wednesday, December 1, 2021

1. Indicate that you accept SJSU's offer of provisional admission. Once you accept, you are making a commitment to attend SJSU and certify that you understand and agree to these terms and conditions.
2. Sign up for Spartan Experience for Transfers (SET), which is SJSU's mandatory orientation program for transfers.
3. Pay the non-refundable \$80 Enrollment Deposit. Your nonrefundable enrollment deposit includes your Spartan Experience for Transfers (SET) orientation payment.

An email confirmation will be sent to you from the [nextsteps@sjsu.edu](mailto:nextsteps@sjsu.edu) email address within 24 hours. Print and keep this email—it is your Next Steps receipt.

If you do not complete the entire Intent to Enroll process by Wednesday, December 1, 2021, we will withdraw your application.

Please contact [nextsteps@sjsu.edu](mailto:nextsteps@sjsu.edu) before the deadline if you have any problems completing these steps.

**Meet International Transfer Admission Requirements**

Meet the CSU minimum requirements including completion of the four basic skills courses with a “C-” or higher and 60 transferable semester units (90 quarter units) by the end of the Fall 2021 term. Failure to pass all four basic skills courses with a “C-” or higher, complete 60 transferable units (90 quarter units) and meet the impaction criteria, will result in your admission being withdrawn.

**Send all required documents on your MySJSU “To Do List” by the posted deadline.**

This includes sending your official, final transcript(s), including any grades for the Fall 2021 term.

You must submit official final transcripts from all colleges attended, postmarked no later than November 1, 2021. You may not use Winter 2021 courses to meet upper division admission requirements for Spring 2022 admission.

**Send official test scores needed to fulfill admission requirements**

If you have taken Advanced Level exams (AP, IB, AL, AS or CLEP) to satisfy any of the CSU admission requirements, request that your official scores are sent directly to SJSU.

**Pass Final Verification**

An internal review of your application will be conducted. Your official final transcript(s) must show that you meet the current impaction criteria and admission requirements in order to pass final verification. Failure to pass final verification will result in your admission being withdrawn.

**Complete the I-20 Process**

If you live outside the United States, you will receive an email containing your I-20 as part of your virtual admission packet.

If you are currently attending an educational institution in the U.S., you must download and have your school complete the required “SEVIS Transfer In Form” listed under ‘Other’ at [sjsu.edu/iss/resources/student-forms](https://sjsu.edu/iss/resources/student-forms) Please submit this form prior to the first day of classes.

**Clear Your Medical Insurance Hold**

International students must provide proof of approved medical insurance before registering for classes. Insurance holds and purchasing of insurance are handled through the International Student and Scholar Services (ISSS) office.

**Monitor Your MySJSU Account – EXTREMELY IMPORTANT**

SJSU communicates almost entirely by messages and “To Do List” items posted to your MySJSU account. Go to <https://one.sjsu.edu> and check your MySJSU account frequently for updates to your status, important messages, and invitations to upcoming events. You are responsible for compliance with all deadlines posted on your MySJSU account regarding outstanding documents. Failure to do so may result in your application or admission being withdrawn even if you have signed up for housing, attended orientation, or registered for Spring 2022 classes. We reserve the right to rescind your admission for non-compliance to the conditions stated in the Terms and Conditions at any time during the process.

**Attend Mandatory Spartan Experience (SET) for Transfers Orientation**

If you do not attend or leave during any portion of the SET orientation, you will not be able to attend SJSU in Spring 2022.

**Attend Mandatory Global Spartan Welcome (GSW)**

F-1 students are required to attend GSW, an orientation program specifically for international students. International Student & Scholar Services (ISSS) will send you registration information prior to the start of the semester.

**Complete the Immigration Document Process**

F-1 students are required to submit immigration documents to complete the SEVIS registration process. ISSS will send you more information prior to the start of the semester.
