We will be continuing to seek CSU funding, but will also be advocating for additional State, Federal and grant funding.

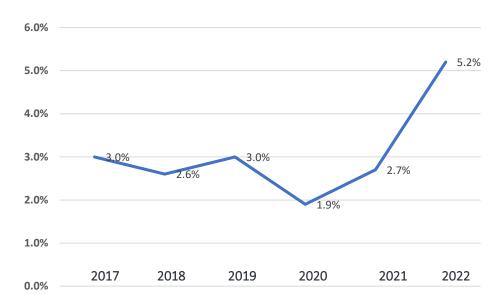

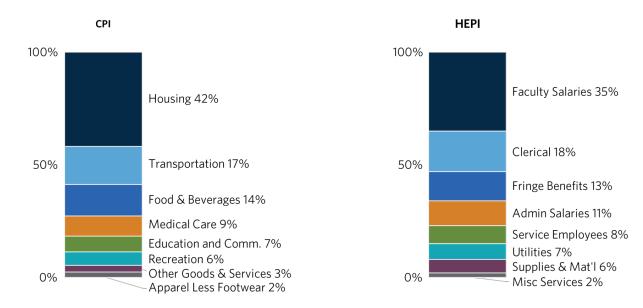

CSU – State Budget "Good News!"

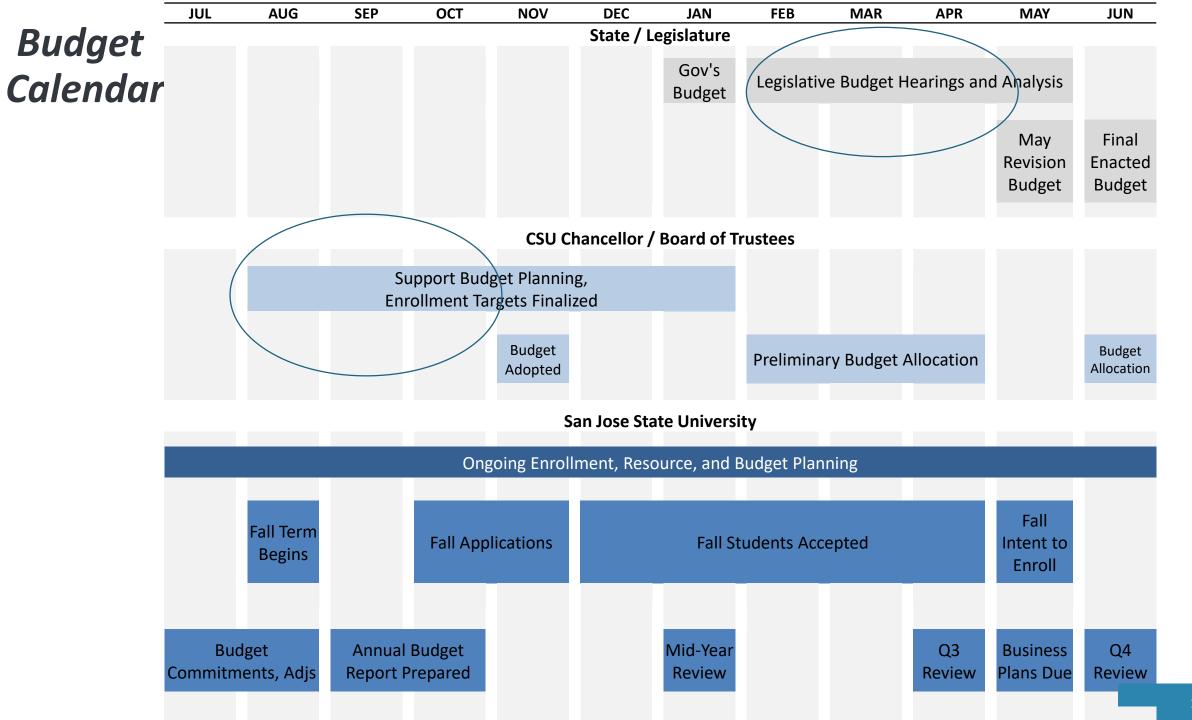
- 5% multi-year Compact established
- Over \$211M of undesignated funding
- GI2025 Basic Needs and Mental Health funding
- Funded enrollment growth
- \$500M+ of infrastructure funding

CSU – State Budget "Good News!"

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CSU – State Budget Reality!

- Compact only yields 3.5% and has required commitments
- Pressure to reduce base funding increases in final budget (Governor)
- No funds for staff or faculty salary studies
- \$125M of infrastructure in 1X funds...SJSU gets \$7M
- HEERF is gone, expenditures remain
- Inflation, supply chain, retention, recruiting, cost of living

General Fund

SJSU's starting point was under staffed / under funded SJSU's Compensation (even more so than the CSU) is under funded

Revenues

Impossible to correct budget without adding Revenue

Changed our way of teaching, learning & operating at significant cost

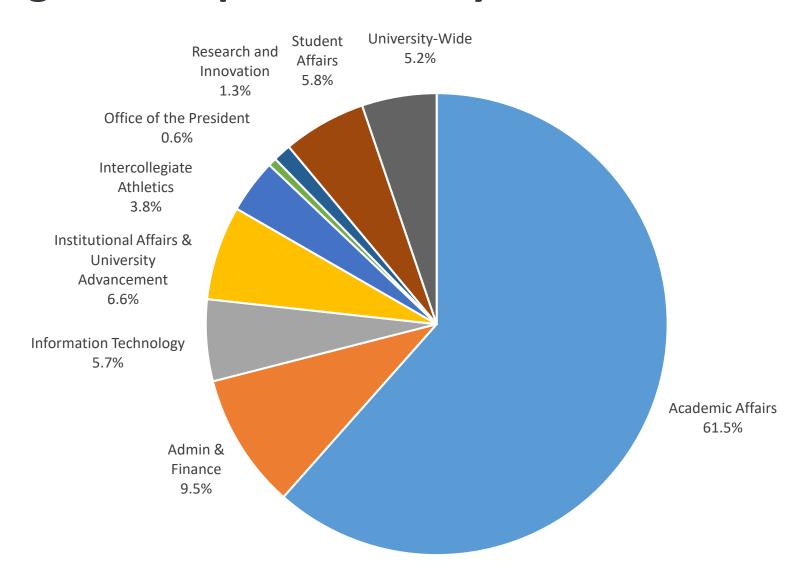

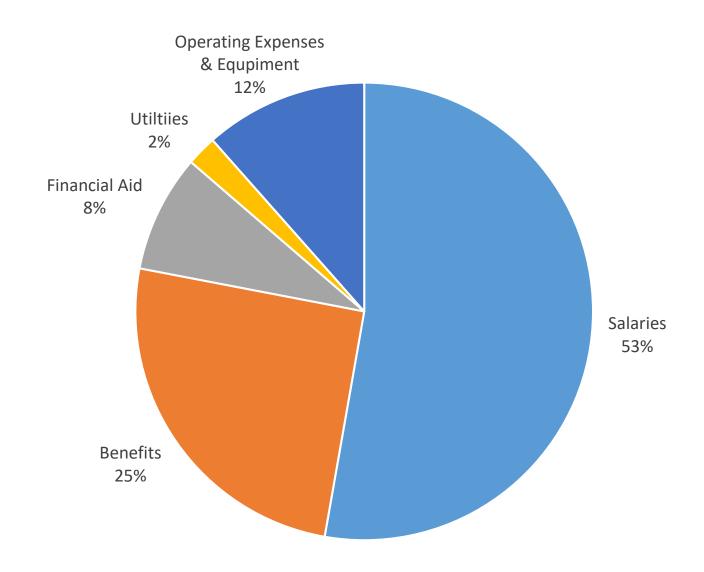

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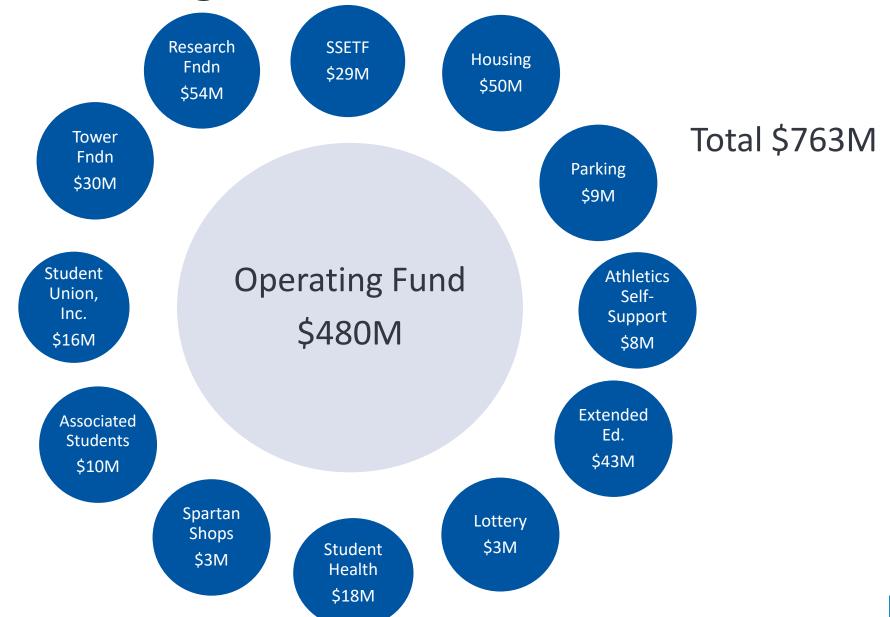
Operating Fund Expenditures by Division 2022-2023 Budget
