Subject: Biennial Call for SSETF Funds

As recently announced to the campus community, the SSETF has been finalized at \$304 (IRA: \$151.50; Course Support: \$31.00; Student Success: \$121.50) per term. The campus has elected to extend the call for funds into the fall term because the fee rates were finalized near the completion of the spring term. In order to improve efficiency and maximize the use of funds, one call will be issued over a two year period. This will provide an opportunity for broader planning and implementation timelines for SSETF funds.

Student Success, Excellence & Technology Fee Requests

This year's call is for Student Success Fee funding <u>only</u>. No new one-time or base funding is available for the Instructionally Related Activities (IRA) or Course Support components of the SSETF. The student success fee supports four of six SSETF initiatives:

- 1. Academic Technology
- 2. 21st Century Teaching Spaces
- 3. Retention & Graduation
- 4. Student Success Services & Graduation Pathways

Based on current enrollment and revenue projections it is estimated that approximately \$775 thousand in new one-time funds per fiscal year are available for a total of \$1.5 million over the two year period. An additional \$1.5 million of one-time carryforward funds will be made available during this cycle, bringing the total one-time funding available for request to \$3 million. No base funding is available this cycle as there is insufficient new revenue to permanently commit to new projects and initiatives.

Each division is invited to submit their requests to the Budget & Risk Management Office by Friday, October 2. Please use the Biennial SSETF Request Form available here.

The Campus Fee Advisory Committee (CFAC) reviews requests for SSETF resources and makes a recommendation to the president based on the guidelines below:
