# **New Faculty Joining KIN**


Beginning the Fall of 2021 and culminating in the Spring of 2022, we have had three successful faculty searches.

KIN Student **Stephanie Wang** was recognized as the department's AKA Award recipient for 2022.



Rebecca is a Physical Education Single Subject Credential candidate at San Jose State University. She is also an intern teacher at Broadway High School in San Jose. Broadway is a continuation high school and the home of the district's Young Families Program for pregnant and parenting teens. This is Rebecca's second year as Director of the Young Families Program, after having worked for two years as the program support specialist seven years ago. She supervises all the services of the program including assistance for the teen parents as well as the on-site daycare for their babies and toddlers. In addition to those duties, Rebecca completed her intern teaching this year in Physical Education. She taught several PE classes at Broadway, including one section for pregnant teens. She volunteered many times this year to cover periods in other subjects when Broadway teachers were out for COVID and other reasons.

Rebecca was recently voted by the staff at Broadway as their Certificated Employee of the Year. She then went on to become a finalist at the district level. At the recognition ceremony on May 10, the President of the San Jose Teachers' Association announced that Rebecca had been selected as San Jose Unified School District's Certificated Employee of the Year for the 2021-22 school year.


# In Memoriam - Warren Fraleigh (1925 -2022)

Warren Fraleigh worked as a professor in the Men's Physical Ed department at SJSU from the 1950s through the late 1960s; he had been charged partly with integrating women into Phys Ed on campus. He left SJSU to become the Dean of Physical Education at a SUNY campus. He met his wife, Sondra Fraleigh while at SJSU--she was a faculty member in the Dance Department.

Warren was born in Detroit, Michigan, on December 26, 1925. He was a child during the great depression, and he belongs to the Greatest Generation. His mother was Ethyl Sarah Dobson, and his father was William Royden Fraleigh. His sister Ruth visited us often when we lived in NY, but I never met his brother Buddy who was killed in World War II. Warren also served in WWII. He joined the navy at age 19 and entered as a submariner. One has to have nerves of steel to serve on a submarine. Warren underwent tests for the ability to spend weeks underwater in close quarters with many other men and to endure possible attacks.

As for his professional life, he earned his college education on the GI Bill of Rights after the war, graduating from Wayne State University first and earning his Ph.D. at the Ohio University. During his education, he taught elementary school and high school physical education. After earning his doctorate, he embarked on a long and eventful university career as a physical education teacher of many sports and became a baseball coach. He taught for many years at San Jose State University. He then became dean of Physical Education and Athletics at Brockport State College, part of the State University of New York. Brockport had a large and prominent faculty of Physical Education at that time. He and his wife moved from California to New York and became part of SUNY in 1970.
