Accessibility Study Project

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Project Overview

At January 6, 2010 Accessible Instructional Materials (AIM) Committee meeting, a recommendation was made to examine a random sample of course syllabi to determine the level of accessibility at SJSU.

Office of Institutional Research provided a randomized list of 10% of Fall 2009 courses with 20 or more students from each College. This list consisted of a total of 121 courses.

CFD launched a special project to examine the accessibility status of these 121 course syllabi during the period of January 14 to 22.

The Methodology

- ☐ Are the syllabi posted or not? List URL if found.
- ☐ Criteria used in assessing accessibility
 - Completely accessible
 - For Word documents:
 - Links with a meaningful website name
 - Images with alternative text
 - Structure with hierarchical heading styles
 - Table with correct reading order, repeated header row, and no nested table
 - For PDF documents:
 - Readable with correct reading order via audio and visual check
 - Document is tagged

The Methodology (cont.)

Criteria used in assessing accessibility (cont.)

- Minimally accessible
 - For Word documents:
 - Missing alt text
 - Table header row is not repeated
 - For PDF documents:
 - Readable but missing tags
- Inaccessible
 - None of the above (no structure, incorrect reading order, not readable, etc.)

Results of Random Course Syllabi

- Total syllabi surveyed = 121
- Not Posted/Found = 75 (62%)
 - 62% of the total 121 syllabi are not posted or not found. (e.g. may be posted on a learning management system, on an individual faculty website, replaced with Spring courses, etc.)
- Posted = 46 (38%)
 - 38% of the syllabi were found and the URLs listed.

Results of Random Course Syllabi (cont.)

Accessibility status of these 46 posted syllabi:

- Completely Accessible = 22 (48%)
- Minimally Accessible = 13 (28%)
- Inaccessible = 11 (24%)

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
