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Study Overview

- The Accessible Technology Initiative Instructional Materials (ATI IM) committee wants to collect an inventory of the types of course materials faculty use in their teaching at SJSU.
- On December 1st, 2016 the Center for Faculty Development sent a survey to faculty and asked them to respond in two weeks.
- 282 responses out of 2058 faculty members were collected by mid December.
- The response rate is: 282/2058 = 13.7%

Total Responses by College (in table format)


282 out of 2058 faculty responded to our survey with 13.7% response rate.

The response rate from each college is listed in table format below.

Q3: Total Responses by College


- 282 out of 2058 faculty members responded to our survey with a response rate of 282/2058 = 13.7%
- The response rate from each college is listed below.
 - > CASA: 51 = 18.1%
 - Business: 22 = 7.8%
 - Education: 34 = 12.1%
 - Engineering: 24 = 8.5%
 - > H & A: 66 = 23.4%
 - > Science: 40 = 14.2%
 - Social Science: 45 = 16%



Q4: Course Format

- The course formats for these 282 faculty members are:
 - Lecture/discussion (N ≤ 50 students) 151 = 53%
 - Lecture/discussion (N = 51 or more students) 51 = 17.9%
 - Seminar: 34 = 11.9%
 - Lab: 14 = 4.9%
 - > Other: 35 = 12.3%


Q5: Course Delivery Mode

The course delivery modes for these 282 faculty members are:

> Face-to-face: 223 = 78.5%

> Hybrid: 40 = 14.1%

Completely online: 21 = 7.4%










Q8: How did you make instructional materials available to students in this class? (in chart format)

Faculty response rate: 282/2058 = 13.7%



Q9: Were any of the students in this class...

- Registered with the AEC Yes = 125 (44.2%); No = 158 (55.8%)
- Blind or visually impairedYes = 6 (2.2%); No = 270 (97.8%)
- Deaf or hard of hearingYes = 18 (6.5%); No = 258 (93.5%)



Implications

Potential concern about the accessibility of course materials used:

- About 68% of faculty report extensive use of paper handouts distributed in class
- 2. 63.4% of respondents post 5 or more course materials in pdf format, 53.5% in ppt slides and 38.9% in Word
- 3. Very few respondents report using DVDs (~3%) or audio files (~8%) in contrast to 35% report using 5 or more streamed videos in class
- 4. 43.7% report using web links in their teaching

Implications (continued)

Potential concern about the accessibility of instructional materials used:

- 5. 64.2% of faculty use traditional textbooks and 32.5% use digital course reader with 14.3% using hard copy of course reader.
- 6. 56.4% regularly posted course materials on Canvas, 38.4% occasionally distributed materials in class with 39.7% distributed via email or student access on their own (33.7%)
- 7. 44.2% of their students registered with AEC do faculty need any support to provide for these AEC students?

The Next Step

- Share these result during outreach meetings and listen to feedback?
- Post result on CFD website.
- Request a sample copy of course materials used in classroom?
- Ask what type of resources would be most useful to them? 1-on-1, step-by-step selfpaced, videos, etc.
