Below are listed the minimum requirements for scales, by level of study:

BM performance, jazz

- 1. Major, natural, harmonic and melodic minor scales. 2 eighths equals 100. Major and minor arpeggios. 3 eighths = 69.
- 2. Same as above, but scales 2 eighths = 120. Also articulation patterns all tongued, all slurred, 2 tongued, 2 slurred.
 - Arpeggios. 3 eighths = 88. Articulation patterns all tongued, all slurred, slurred groups of 3.
- 3. Same as above, and all chromatic scales. 4 sixteenths = 80. Arpeggios, 3 eighths = 120.
- 4. Same as above, 4 sixteenths = 100. Arpeggios, 3 eighths = 120. Add dominant 7ths.
- 5. Scales, 4 sixteenths = 120. Add whole tone scales, 2 eighths = 120. Arpeggios, 3 eighths = 120. Add diminished 7ths, 4 sixteenths = 80.
- 6. Scales as before, whole tone 4 sixteenths = 100. Arpeggios as before. Add augmented arpeggios.
- 7. Scales as before, all at 4 sixteenths = 120. Arpeggios as before.
- 8. All as before.

BM education, BA music

- 1. Major, and natural minor scales. 2 eighths equals 100. Major arpeggios. 3 eighths = 69.
- Add harmonic minors. 2 eighths = 120.
 Major and minor arpeggios. 3 eighths = 88.
- 3. Add melodic minors, varying articulations. 4 sixteenths = 80 Arpeggios 3 eighths = 120.
- 4. Add chromatic scales. 4 sixteenths = 100. Arpeggios 3 eighths = 120.
- 5. Scales 4 sixteenths = 120. Arpeggios as before. Add dominant 7ths.
- 6. Add diminished arpeggios.
- 7. As before.
- 8. As before.
