SUMMARY

During the 2007/2008 academic year 212 reports of violations of the Academic Integrity Policy were filed with the Office of Student Conduct and Ethical Development. Sixty-five (65) were for incidents of cheating and the remaining one hundred forty-six (147) were for plagiarism. The listings that follow delineate the cases according to the sanctions given and the origination of the case.
