First Year Course Placement 2024

The CSU evaluates academic preparation though **Multiple Measures** criteria, which take into account...

- Overall HS GPA
- HS Math GPA
- Accumulated coursework
- Some senior year coursework

- Standardized tests...
 - AP/IB Exams
 - CLEP Exams
 - CAASPP/SBAC


SAT and ACT

 Campus-based measures such as the Reflection on College Writing (RCW) and Precalculus Proficiency Assessment (PPA)



First Year Course Placement 2024

On the basis of this evaluation, students will be placed into one of four enrollment categories in Mathematics and Writing:



Cat I: Fulfilled the GE Area (A2 or B4)

Cat II: Ready to enroll in a GE class without support

Cat III: Ready to enroll in a supported GE class; Early Start recommended Cat IV: Ready to enroll in a supported GE class; Early Start strongly recommended 4



What does does it mean for a course to be "Supported?"



Students in enrollment categories III and IV will enroll in **supported** courses.

- Stretch courses
- Co-requisite courses
- Embedded tutors or mentors




Why Do Enrollment Categories Matter?

Your enrollment categories determine...

- Your first year course options
- The forms of academic support available to you

Your Early Start opportunities





Are there any special considerations in Math?

All majors are categorized by curricular focus:

- STEM/Business Administration
- Statistics-based
- Non-STEM
- Undeclared

Math enrollment categories are calculated differently for students entering majors that require calculus.





How do I check my enrollment categories?

Your enrollment categories may change throughout the summer as we receive test scores and evaluate your final transcript. To check your current categories in your MySJSU, look at your CSU Program Page in MySJSU...



Science, Engineering, & Mathematics: A Calculus Pathway

Category M-IV

Category M-II (or III) MATH 18A: College Algebra (+ co-requisite support with PPA) Category M-I, II, III, or IV + PPA MATH 71 or 71X: Calculus for Business and Aviation



STEM Math Pathways at SJSU

- **Business Administration: A Third Intensive Math Pathway**
- **Category M-IV**
- MATH 01: Math Reasoning + co-requisite support

Category M-II (or III) MATH 18A: College Algebra (+ co-requisite support with PPA) Category M-I, II, III, or IV + PPA MATH 70 or 70X: Mathematics for Business



STEM Math Pathways at SJSU

Q: "It looks as though I'll be M-II, III, or IV and I want to get into a Calculus class right away. How do I do that?"

A: Unless you have AP exam credit, IB exam credit, CLEP credit, or transfer credit from a community college, you will have to take the **Precalculus Proficiency Assessment (PPA)**.

After May 15 (Intent to Enroll), check your MySJSU Message Center for information from the **SJSU Testing Office** about the PPA. If you do not complete the PPA before Orientation, you may have a chance to complete it **early in the morning** of the first day. (**Not recommended!**)



Non-STEM Math Pathways at SJSU

Statistics:

• There are **7** different versions of **Elementary Statistics** at SJSU. The one you take will be determined by your major and enrollment category.

Humanities and Arts:

- CS 22A: Python for Everyone
- MATH 10A: Mathematics in Art & Music (+ co-requisite support)
- MATH 10D: Probability, Data Science, Ethics, and You (+ co-requisite support)
- MATH 10P: Mathematics in Politics (+ co-requisite support)
- LING 26: Quantitative Reasoning in Linguistic Diversity (+ co-requisite support)
- PHIL 09: Mathematics and Logic for General Education (+ co-requisite support)
 Undeclared:
- Undeclared students will work with Exploratory Student Success Center (ESSC) to follow the math pathway of their intended major.

Supported Math Pathways at SJSU

Q: "I have been placed into M-III or M-IV but I feel I should be in M-II. What can I do to change my course options?"

A: If you feel that your enrollment category is inaccurate on the basis of your academic credentials, contact Supported Instruction to appeal your placement. Be prepared to explain what multiple measures criteria would place you in a higher enrollment category. The email address is supportedinstruction@sjsu.edu.



Written Communication Pathways at SJSU

Reflection on College Writing (RCW):

Before Frosh Orientation, students are required to complete an online reflection exercise in Canvas designed to gauge their level of comfort with academic reading and writing.






Written Communication Pathways at SJSU

Course Options to satisfy written communication (A2) for students in W-II, W-III, and W-IV:

- English 1A: Students who feel comfortable with the RCW tasks may choose a one-semester writing course.
- English 1AF and English 1AS: Students who do not feel confident completing the RCW tasks may choose a two-semester stretch writing course.
 Students who choose the stretch option must enroll in the second semester course in the spring.





A2 and B4 Expectations for Completion

- All students must enroll in A2 and/or B4 courses in their first year of enrollment.
- Students in the W-IV and/or M-IV enrollment categories must enroll in A2 and/or B4 classes in the fall term of their first year and must remain continuously enrolled in A2 and/or B4 courses until these GE requirements are met.





A2 and B4 Expectations for Completion

- Students who do not satisfy their A2 and/or B4 requirements in their first year (including summer) will be placed upon administrative academic probation (AAP) before the start of the second year.
- Those who do not complete A2 and/or B4 by the end of the second year of enrollment (including summer) may be withdrawn from the university under administrative academic disqualification (AADQ).





Early Start Program 2024



Early Start is an online summer skill-building program for students in the supported enrollment categories.

- Recommended but not required for students in math categories M-III and M-IV. Some options are available for students in M-II.
- This summer, we have space for 400 first year students.
 Most Pell-eligible students receive a full fee waiver for their Early Start classes.
