




Counseling Services










Deaf and Hard of Hearing (DHOH)



- Facilitates communication in support of curriculum access in the classroom, advisement/instructor meetings, campus events or anytime an accommodation is curriculum related (e.g.: clinicals, practicums, student teaching).

- Provides professional Educational Sign Language Interpreting and Educational Real-Time Captioning services.
- Notetaking services and an Assistive Listening Device (ALD) Loaner Program are also available.





Undergraduate Advising @ SJSU Over The Years...

- → 1980s (or earlier): General Education Advising Center
 - Faculty advisors on assigned time
- → Early 2000s: Academic Advising & Retention Services (AARS)
 - Professional staff Advisors, GE Advising, Undeclared Advising, Retention
- → Mid-2000s 2020: College Student Success Centers developed
 - Professional staff Advisors, GE Advising, Retention, Tutoring, Graduation
 Advising, Workshops, Career Center and Identity Center Liaisons, some

Undergraduate Advising Transitions

- Cohort-based caseload advising for first and second year students
- Fall 2022 First-year students assigned to SASS advisors in their college Student Success Centers (approx. 200:1 ratio)
- SASS = Student Academic Success Specialist
- Proactive/intrusive advising and success coaching model focused on outreach and engagement
- Students stay with SASS advisor through <u>first 60 units</u>

Develop new Undergraduate Advising & Success structure and training program

Advising Center Directors collaborate with Undergraduate Education to develop

Train SASS Team in preparation for Summer Orientation

Collaboration phase to develop transition plan for next 2 years

Implement new SASS advising model for incoming First-year Students

Implement new model in stages, in collaboration with undergraduate advising



Informational Updates

- REMINDER: Students on academic probation who do not earn at least a 2.0 semester GPA in Fall 2021 will be disqualified
- Students who have not completed their attestation of COVID-19 vaccination or approved exemption by September 30th will be removed from in-person or hybrid classes, and denied access to campus facilities
