- Who is the intended audience for this assignment?
  - The intended audience appears to be fellow students, as the assignment is described as a 'post,' as on a discussion board with peers.
- What do you understand is the purpose or goal of this assignment?
  - The goal of the assignment is to make the author write within a very strictly defined ruleset and learn how to accomplish a task when a restrictive frame is put into place.
- How do you think the assignment should be completed? What needs to be turned in? Please describe the kind of paper you would write in response to this assignment.
  - The assignment describes writing a short post, but I would have to develop one to three rough drafts before final submission. I think the assignment should or would be completed by taking the ten constraints and making them into a checklist.
- What resources can or should be used to complete this assignment? (e.g., sample/model papers, class textbook, research articles, experiment data, etc.)
  - A 'text' is needed to provide a quote in the middle of the post, but no specifics about what kind of text that is listed.

  - I would like to know the due date of the assignment. Since it is a 'post,' I would also like to know if this is for Canvas. I understand what is expected of me, as the instructions are clear. I think, if I were a student who did not have a scientific background, I might need a definition of "empirically verifiable" as stated in 7) of the Instructions.
- What do you find the most intriguing or interesting part of the assignment?
  - The most interesting part of the assignment is the idea of the constraints themselves. With such stringent guidelines, as a student I would have to really sit and think about how I want to approach my post. I appreciate that there are constraints not only for the subject matter, but also at the level of sentences and words themselves.
- How many hours do you think it would take a student to complete this assignment adequately (e.g., 4-5 hours)?
  - Likely 1-2 hours at most. I would devote ten to fifteen minutes to reviewing the instructions to fully
    understand what is required from each constraint, as part of that time frame.
- What are one to three concrete suggestions for how to improve the clarity or organization of the assignment's instructions?
  - O 1) As a student, I would appreciate a brief overview of the assignment as it would be more accessible for me. Providing both the video link and a short summary may make it more approachable for different learning styles; 2) Having an additional sentence or two explaining how points will be lost by not following a constraint may improve understanding of the grading schema.
